



## Graduation News



On May 30, 2012, on the 70th anniversary of their student termination, UBC held a special graduation ceremony to honour Japanese Canadian students whose education was interrupted due to the unjust internment of Japanese Canadians beginning in 1942. The ceremony re-conferred degrees on those students who were able to complete prior to internment but were not allowed to attend the 1942 ceremony, and conferred Honourary degrees on those students who were not able to complete their education due to the interruption and internment. ## Laboratory of Archaeology (LOA)



LOA is pleased to announce that **Elizabeth McManus** has been hired as LOA's first archivist for a six month term. Elizabeth has a long experience working or volunteering with LOA. She began in 2005 volunteering for Sue Rowley and a year and a half later was hired on the Partnership of Peoples project. Towards the end of that project Elizabeth returned to school and completed a Master of Archival Studies degree. During her time as a student she continued to work with LOA as a work study student on the

documentation collections. Elizabeth's thesis focus throughout her studies was on records of archaeologists and her thesis was titled "Unearthing Archives: An Examination of Documents Generated by Archaeologists in Canada".

Elizabeth has adopted using ICA-Atom to describe and make available the materials held in the LOA archives. This software has been adopted by archives such as the City of Vancouver Archives, and MOA archives. It will allow archaeologists to browse descriptions of the holdings and look at images. Most of our holdings relate to the artifact collections housed by LOA such as field notes, maps, letters, and analysis. In addition, LOA archives has a large slide collection used in the past for teaching, and the fonds of Jack Sewell and Erna C. von Engle-Baiersdorf which are in the process of being digitized and will soon be available. Currently this database is accessible in the LOA labs at MOA, and in the LOA archives but will soon be available on any internet connected computer. LOA archives is located in the MOA library and is open on Thursdays from 10-4, and with appointment on Wednesday and Friday. 
