
The Department of Anthropology and the Office of the President hosted the President's Lecture Series on January 24, 2019. The title of the talk was, "Capacity, corporeality, containment: Boundary maintenance and social exclusion in Malaysia and Australia."

The speaker, Dr. Lenore Manderson, is a Distinguished Professor of Public Health and Medical Anthropology in the School of Public Health, University of the Witwatersrand and Distinguished Visiting Professor of

Environmental Science, Institute at Brown for Environment and Society.

Manderson is known internationally for her work on inequality and social exclusion, the social context of infectious and chronic disease, gender, sexuality and caregiving; in the US, her work focuses on art/science intersections relating to climate change.

Sara Shneiderman received a **SSHRC Explore Grant** from the Faculty of Arts for the project "Nepal's Post-Earthquake Reconstruction Outcomes: A Quantitative Survey in Conjunction" with the SSHRC PDG "Expertise, Labour and Mobility in Nepal's Post-Conflict, Post-Disaster Reconstruction."

Shneiderman will work collaboratively with Dr. Ratna Shrestha of UBC's Vancouver School of Economics, Professor Philippe Le Billon of Geography/SPPGA, and Dr. Jeevan Baniya of Social Science Baha in Nepal, with additional support from Sampada KC, to conduct and analyze a 400-household quantitative survey in two districts of Nepal. The survey will ask whether funds invested in reconstruction after the country's massive 2015 earthquakes have led to the desired outcomes, both in terms of physical completion of reconstructed homes, and homeowner satisfaction.

Shneiderman also gave an online lecture about her current research, "Expertise, Labour and Mobility in Nepal's Post-Conflict, Post-Disaster Reconstruction" in the Peter Wall Institute for Advanced Studies Speaker Series. Click here to watch the video online.
