Sabina Magliocco collaborated with Dr. Patrick Pennefather (Department of Theatre and Film) and Dr. Greg Mackie (Department of English) to help create a virtual exhibit on the works of Shakespeare at the Vancouver Art Gallery. The exhibit highlights UBC's recent acquisition, thanks to generous donors, of a First Folio -- the only publicly-owned one in Western Canada. Framing the Folio in its broader historical, cultural, and social contexts using virtual reality, the exhibit features the witches from "Macbeth" as they would look and speak today. Sabina wrote their script in iambic pentameter, and served as a consultant on the appearance of contemporary witches.
